

Cultivar	Description	Price
Heuchera 'Amethyst Myst'	A totally new shade of purple compared to other heucheras. This selection has blackish-purple leaves with a silvery-blue overlay and extensive black veining. The plant seems to glow with an "amethyst mist" from a distance, the characteristic for which it is named. The new foliage is deep maroon-purple and all leaves have rich royal purple undersides. Tiny cream-colored flowers appear on 26 inch scapes, but this plant is grown mainly for its foliage.	9.99
Heuchera 'Black Beauty'	This selection sports deep reddish-purple, glossy, pointed leaves with outstanding ruffling. They are held somewhat upright, catching and reflecting the sun from every direction. The plant's habit is compact and mounding. White flowers are produced on 24 inch tall scapes from late spring through early summer.	11.99
Heuchera 'Blackout'	Similar to 'Obsidian', this hybrid has very glossy, near-jet black leaves with perfectly rounded lobes. It forms a tight, compact mound that looks great as edging or in containers and produces cream colored flowers. 'Blackout' was hybridized by Dirk Scheys of Belgium.	12.99
Heuchera 'Caramel'	The first in a group of H. villosa hybrids from Thierry Delabroye of France, discovered by his wife, Sandrine. 'Caramel' is a robust grower with fuzzy, bright yellow-orange leaves and purple-red undersides. It has much brighter coloration than H. 'Amber Waves' and has a fabulous compact habit. It looks great in containers or as edging.	12.99
Heuchera 'Chocolate Ruffles'	Solid deep maroon-chocolate leaves with heavily ruffled edges curl to reveal the royal purple undersides of this selection. To compliment the compact mound of foliage, strong purple spikes about 30 inches tall carry an abundance of small purplish flowers that are great for fresh cut bouquets. Once you see this heuchera, you will know why this is one of America's favorites! At the 1995 Plantarium, it won the highest gold medal award as the "Best New Perennial Introduction".	11.99
Heuchera 'Christa'	The young foliage of H. 'Christa' PPAF is nearly all rose-purple with a peach underlay. As the leaves mature, the peach color becomes dominant. Light pink flowers are produced in midsummer. This cultivar is similar to 'Caramel' but the foliage is a brighter orange color and the plant is a bit more compact in habit.	12.99
Heuchera 'Citronelle'	Citronelle' is a robust hybrid with citron yellow leaves and silver undersides. When planted in heavier shade, the leaves will be more chartreuse. Since the leaves are so light in color, this variety appreciates more shade than some of the other villosa hybrids. 'Citronelle' is a sport of the popular 'Caramel' and has the same great compact habit. It is from Thierry Delabroye of France.	12.99
Heuchera 'Color Dream'	Purple foliage with a silver sheen that develops distinct red edges in midsummer will give rise to frothy white flowers in June to July. The striking foliage of 'Color Dream' will take on an almost "evergreen" quality.	10.99
Heuchera 'Dark Secret'	Discovered by Luc Klinkhamer of CNB Greenteam, this hybrid is a seedling of three top-selling varieties of Heuchera: 'Obsidian', 'Crimson Curls', and 'Frosted Violet'. It is a true hybrid of the three, displaying characteristics of each: deep purple-bronze coloring from 'Obsidian', a slight silvery sheen on the leaf surface from 'Frosted Violet', and heavily ruffled margins from 'Crimson Curls'. Cream flowers are produced atop deep purple stems in early to midsummer.	12.99
Heuchera 'Encore'	'Encore' starts out in the spring with deep rose purple colored leaves that have a light silvering on top, darker veins, and vibrant reddish-purple undersides. As they mature, the leaves turn lighter rose with a heavy silver overlay and smoky purple veins. It was hybridized by Thierry Delabroye of France	12.99
Heuchera 'Frosted Violet'	A vigorous, widely clumping heuchera with broad leaves. This one seems to glow from a distance! The new leaves are deep maroon-purple, while the older ones are deep plum purple with darker veining. The fine hairs which cover the leaves catch the light, giving them a "frosted" appearance. The plum-colored undersides exhibit the same characteristic. These colors intensify with the cool fall weather. This selection produces 30 inch flower scapes lined with dainty flowers that look like pink seed pearls.	11.99
Heuchera 'Georgia Peach'	You'll be blown away by the spectacular glowing peach colored foliage of this new Heuchera from Terra Nova Nurseries! The very large leaves, which can measure up to 8" across, have rounded lobes and are dusted with a light silver overlay. In fall and winter, the foliage turns a warm rose-purple color. Dainty creamy white flowers are produced in early summer. Very unique!	12.99
Heuchera 'Green Spice'	This one will really spice up your shade garden! The broad, green leaves of this variety have a silvery overlay, darker green edges, and outstanding beet-red veination. These colors are particularly strong during the cooler months. In early summer, tiny cream flowers are produced on 28 inch scapes. Extending its ornamental value even further into the season, the leaves take on brilliant shades of red and orange in the fall. This heuchera goes with everything--It's a must-have for the garden!	11.99

<b>Heuchera 'Hercules'</b>	A must-have for collectors! This selection from Herbert Oudshoorn of The Netherlands could be grown for its fantastic foliage alone, but has the added appeal of producing deep scarlet red flowers in early to midsummer. The foliage is heavily marbled with green and cream; this variegation is very stable compared to older marbled varieties. It is a strong grower and forms a sizable mound of evergreen foliage.	12.99
<b>Heuchera 'Hollywood'</b>	One of the showiest of all coral bells, 'Hollywood' PP17129 dazzles onlookers with its dense spikes of coral red flowers all spring and summer long. It is a strong rebloomer that makes a great cut flower. White-veiled, lightly ruffled, purple leaves add to the appeal. This selection will flower best in full sun to part shade.	12.99
<b>Heuchera 'Kassandra'</b>	NEW! This heuchera is a vigorous grower that shows a lot of very interesting leaf changes throughout the growing season. In the spring it emerges caramel to orange, and is maroon to a reddish pink by the end of the season. White flowers top the 20-inch tall clump in July.	12.99
<b>Heuchera 'Lime Rickey'</b>	A Terra Nova Introduction. Like freshly squeezed lime juice in a tropical drink, this one is a real breakthrough in Heuchera colors. Frosted, ruffled leaves are a shocking lime-green. Small, pure white flowers appear in spring atop 17 inch scapes. This selection is showy year 'round with minor winter protection. It grows best in partial to full shade. Try using this one in combination container plantings with purple-leaved heucheras	11.99
<b>Heuchera 'Magic Color'</b>	Very colourful variety with many changes throughout the season. Leaves are bright green with red veins and gold edges when they first emerge in the spring. They then go through a unique pink stage before changing to silver with purple veins and red edges.	11.99
<b>Heuchera 'Marmalade'</b>	A big brother for H. 'Amber Waves', the foliage of this selection ranges in color from umber to deep sienna. The rich, shiny, undulating leaves are of heavy substance, helping them to stand up to inclement weather. A plethora of reddish-brown flowers appear on 16 inch scapes from late spring to early summer. This selection grows best in partial to full sun.	12.99
<b>Heuchera 'Melting Fire'</b>	This new seed variety of Heuchera is named for the bright red color of its new foliage in spring. The mature foliage is deep maroon with heavily ruffled edges. Dark red stems carry a profusion of white flowers in late spring and early summer.	8.99
<b>Heuchera <i>micranta</i> 'Palace Purple'</b>	The original purple coral bells, 'Palace Purple' is perhaps the most well-recognized and widely planted variety of all heucheras. It was the 1991 Perennial Plant Association Plant of the Year. This selection has very large, shiny, and star-shaped leaves compared to most other heucheras, ranging in color from deep olive green to purplish-bronze. Their undersides, which are quite visible in the loosely formed clumps, are a striking metallic amethyst purple	8.99
<b>Heuchera 'Midnight Rose'</b>	A sport of the ever-popular 'Obsidian', this incredibly unique selection has the same deep black-purple leaves as its parent but with hot pink spots and flecks that emerge in spring. As the season progresses, the spots expand and then lighten to a pale creamy pink. There's nothing else like it! This Heuchera is grown for its fantastic foliage rather than its insignificant flowers.	12.99
<b>Heuchera 'Miracle'</b>	A "miracle" breakthrough in Heuchera breeding! This sister seedling of 'Tiramisu' produces pink flowers in midsummer. This is very unusual for a H. villosa hybrid since most others have cream colored flowers. During the cooler weather of spring and fall, the foliage is a fantastic shade of brick red with bright chartreuse to gold edges and silvered undersides. During the warmer months of summer, the red pigments lighten and the leaves turn green. 'Miracle' was hybridized by Thierry Delabroye of France.	12.99
<b>Heuchera 'Mocha'</b>	'Mocha' is the largest, darkest-leaved heuchera we've ever seen! The young leaves are bronze-purple with royal purple undersides, while the mature leaves are very dark purple to near-black and can grow larger than one's hand. You have to see it to believe it! It was hybridized by Thierry Delabroye of France.	12.99
<b>Heuchera 'Neptune'</b>	Pewter-purple leaves with very dark veining. Leaves are slightly divided giving the plant a lively texture. 12 inches. Full sun to part shade and a well-drained soil. Zone 4-8. Great choice for butterfly, hummingbird and cut flower gardens.	9.99
<b>Heuchera 'Obsidian'</b>	Obsidian is the result of volcanic lava coming in contact with water. This process results in a glassy finish. Heuchera 'Obsidian' exhibits this same glassy sheen and is closer to black than any other heuchera. The surface and edges of the rounded leaves are so smooth they look like they have been polished. Their undersides are deep purple and exhibit the same glassy finish. Though this selection is grown mainly for its unusual foliage, its ornamental value is enhanced by the 24 inch tall scapes which bear smoky purple buds that open to cream flowers. This selection forms a very compact, tight mound of foliage, making it ideal as an edging or in containers. It's fabulous when paired with brightly colored flowers and foliage in the garden. This new variety is destined to become a favorite!	13.99

<b>Heuchera 'Paris'</b>	The best reblooming heuchera we've ever seen. This free-flowering cultivar produces a plethora of large, deep rose-pink flowers on 14 inch scapes beginning in late spring. A single stem can reportedly bloom continuously for up to 2 months! Deadheading plants will promote rebloom. The foliage of this showy cultivar is cool green with a bright silver overlay.	12.99
<b>Heuchera 'Peach Flambe'</b>	Get out your sunglasses! This heuchera literally GLOWS bright peach in spring in summer before turning plum-purple in winter. The leaves are also infused with flaming red, hence its common name. This selection differs from 'Marmalade' and 'Amber Waves' by having larger, smoother, more brightly colored leaves. It grows vigorously into a medium-sized plant. White flowers are produced in spring. 'Peach Flambe' PP17195 is a versatile heuchera; it looks great both in the garden and in combination container plantings.	12.99
<b>Heuchera 'Pistache'</b>	Pistache' is a robust grower with large, light lime green to chartreuse-yellow leaves depending on the sun exposure. The color is a perfect foil for blue hostas or purple-leaved heucheras. However, since the leaves are so light in color, this variety appreciates more shade than some of the other villosa hybrids. May develop a red edge in fall. It is from Thierry Delabroye of France.	12.99
<b>Heuchera 'Plum Pudding'</b>	Not the typical burgundy color of some heucheras, this variety sports leaves that are truly plum purple with even darker purple veins. They are attractively ruffled and have bluntly pointed tips. The newer leaves are somewhat glossy, and all have deep purple undersides. This heuchera forms a spreading clump and makes a fantastic groundcover when planted en masse. The dainty cream flowers which appear on 26 inch scapes are an added bonus in early summer.	11.99
<b>Heuchera 'Prince of Silver'</b>	This recent hybrid Coral Bells selection is a terrific foliage plant for adding a touch of colour towards the front of a shady garden. The rounded leaves are silver with contrasting veins of deep plum purple. Sprays of ivory-pink flowers appear in late spring, held above the foliage on taller purple stems. Plants may tolerate full sun in cool summer regions. Excellent in the border, for edging, or in tubs and mixed containers.	10.99
<b>Heuchera 'Purple Petticoats'</b>	A tough plant with a frilly appearance. This multiple award winner has dark purple, very heavily ruffled foliage that remains attractive right through winter. It is a fast grower, great for filling in the front of the border or in containers. Insignificant flowers are produced in early summer. This selection does best in full sun or part shade.	11.99
<b>Heuchera 'Rave On'</b>	Representing a breakthrough in heuchera flowering, 'Rave On' reportedly produces more flowers than any other Heuchera in trials. This plant blooms the heaviest in late spring, with masses of deep pink flowers on tall stems that are perfect for cutting. They are a florist's delight! The foliage of this showy cultivar provides great contrast to the brightly colored flowers. The leaves are deep greenish purple with a very heavy silver overlay.	11.99
<b>Heuchera sanguinea 'Ruby Bells'</b>	A myriad of relatively large, showy, intense blood red flowers are held in well-branched panicles and persist for 4-8 weeks beginning in late spring. They have a subtle, sweet fragrance and make a bold statement in the garden. They even attract butterflies! Removing spent flower stalks will extend the bloom time. This selection has green leaves and a compact mounding growth habit.	9.99
<b>Heuchera 'Saturn'</b>	H. 'Saturn' is a part of the "Planet Collection" from the Netherlands. The foliage has dark veining over a pewter background with narrow reddish edges. The 12-14 inch stems carry stunning cream colored flowers.	10.99
<b>Heuchera 'Silver Scrolls'</b>	An enchanting looking heuchera, this selection displays leaves with such crisp color patterning that they look like little stained glass windows. They range in color from season to season in response to changing light levels. In spring, they are deep grape purple with a heavy steel-grey overlay and crisp veination. Their undersides are royal purple, revealed by the curling of the leaves. During the winter, the foliage turns to a rich violet hue. Though the extraordinary foliage is reason enough to grow this plant, it has the added bonus of producing rose-pink buds which open to greenish-cream flowers on 24 inch scapes in late spring.	11.99
<b>Heuchera 'Swirling Fantasy'</b>	This selection features purple and pewter leaves, with a contrasting display of deep red flowers held above in loose sprays. An excellent choice for rock gardens, edging, the perennial border and in tubs or containers. Remove faded flower stems at the base to encourage repeat blooming. Happy in sun or partial shade. Foliage should not be trimmed back in the fall; tidy up in spring by removing any tired-looking leaves.	10.99
<b>Heuchera 'Tara'</b>	Adding to the colorful array of new Heucheras coming from breeder Thierry Delabroye of France is this new golden yellow variety. In spring, the leaves emerge golden yellow with a bright red center and veining. As they mature, the leaves turn pure golden yellow. White flowers appear in midsummer.	12.99
<b>Heuchera 'Tiramisu'</b>	Tiramisu' is a very showy H. villosa hybrid and it represents a breakthrough in heuchera breeding. In both spring and fall, the chartreuse foliage has a heavy smattering of brick red coloration that radiates out from the midrib of each leaf. During the summer, the leaves lighten to chartreuse and develop a light silver overlay. 'Tiramisu' has a fantastic compact habit, so it looks great in containers or as edging. This absolutely unique heuchera is from hybridizer Thierry Delabroye of France.	12.99

<b>Heuchera 'Venus'</b>	Large, silver leaves with deep green veins. Forms a nice compact mound of foliage. Use it to complement purple heucheras or to brighten up a dark corner. Slender scapes carry the nearly white flowers. Part of the "Planet Collection" from the Netherlands.	11.99
<b>Heucherella 'Alabama Sunrise'</b>	Terra Nova's first Heucherella introduction that is a H. villosa hybrid! Why is this significant? The villosa species is more heat and drought tolerant, making this an ideal selection for regions with hot, steamy summers. There are plenty of other reasons to fall in love with this new Heucherella: very large, deeply incised, brilliantly colored leaves and a vigorous, robust habit. In spring, the leaves are gold with sharply contrasting red veining. This color remains throughout most of the summer, then greens up a bit but retains the red veining. In the fall and winter, the evergreen foliage turns a warm shade of orange-pink. Small white flowers are produced in late spring and early summer. Heucherella is a hybrid genus produced from a cross between Heuchera and Tiarella.	12.99
<b>Heucherella 'Burnished Bronze'</b>	Heucherella is a hybrid genus produced from a cross between Heuchera and Tiarella. The large, deeply divided leaves of this variety have a glossy, burnished bronze finish and resemble the leaves of the newer tiarellas. Starry pink flowers appear on 18 inch tall, branched scapes much like those of heucheras. They can even repeat bloom! Combine with Heuchera 'Caramel' for terrific contrast.	12.99
<b>Heucherella 'Stoplight'</b>	You'll stop in your tracks when you see the new H. 'Stoplight' PP16835! Radiant yellow leaves have a large, dark red blotch in the center which feathers out through the veins. The foliage of this selection is larger and more yellow with a darker blotch than H. 'Sunspot' PP14825. White flowers are produced on 12 inch tall stalks beginning in late spring.	12.99
